The Government regulations state '**You can leave home to attend or visit a place of worship for communal worship... You should follow the guidance on the safe use of places of worship and must not mingle with anyone outside your household or support bubble when attending a place of worship**'. We shall remain open unless told otherwise and as long as we have volunteers. We must at this critical time, follow all the pandemic guidelines. Please make sure that you are familiar with what to do—see other page. These measures, if properly followed, help prevent the transmission of the virus. Restrictions can be changed by the government at short notice: please be aware that all our arrangements might therefore have to change quickly too. Equally, the availability of volunteers and clergy might suddenly change through illness or the need to isolate. The website, news sheet and notices on the church doors will carry news. Please remember that the obligation to be at Mass remains suspended. No one should be doing anything that makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable. Please consider carefully any risk you may be taking in coming to Mass. Is your own health good? Are you responsible for caring for someone else? Do have a job that places you at risk or needs you to stay away from risk? What do your family think? Have you been exposed to Covid-19? When you do come always remember - **HANDS - FACE - SPACE KEEP APART BY 2 METRES (6 FEET)** We **ALL** have a Christian duty to keep everyone in church **and** in wider society as safe as possible.

'Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ' St Jerome once said. We hope to have an online Lent course based around Scripture for this year continues to be the 'Year of the Word'.

FR STEPHEN WRITES: The preaching of Jonah stirs the sinners of Nineveh to repent. God has no need to punish them. In the Gospel, Jesus calls Simon and Andrew, James and John from their nets and they follow Him for they too want to follow a new life. Jesus's first recorded words are about the nearness of God's kingdom and a command to us to 'Repent and believe'. Leave behind old sinful ways and believe in the loving and merciful God. A fresh start. The Ninevites were spared earthly disaster by their fresh start. The first Apostles - and you and me - are offered new life indeed—the life of the risen Christ. As we hear Holy Scripture today, remember that as today's Sunday of the Word of God reminds us, Scripture is not simply a collection of nice holy stories. It is written at the direct inspiration of the Holy Spirit to reveal the Father's plan for our salvation through his Son. It is thus words 'alive and active', bringing God's presence and will to the world today – here and now! Therefore, Scripture deserves reverence and attention. That is why Eastern Christians acclaim the reading of Scripture with a commanding announcement 'Wisdom! Let us attend!' In God we find all wisdom; it is folly not to give Him our attention wherever we find Him.

FR PETER REFLECTS: A headline in my paper caught my attention, as it reminded me of my late Aunt's hobby: "Feathered friends to get us twitching in our gardens". Through her trusty war-time binoculars, she joyfully pointed out to me sparrows, robins, goldfinches, starlings, and blue and grey tits. This weekend the RSPB invite us to log their presence too. On my shelves, I have a fascinating book by the writer John Stott called: *The Birds Our Teachers*. He points out that Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount, tells us to notice the birds of the air – because they remind us of God's love. Stott then quotes the famous

rhyme by E Cheney: "Said the Robin to the Sparrow I should really like to know why these anxious human beings rush about and worry so". Said the Sparrow to the Robin, "Friend, I think that it must be they have no Heavenly Father such as cares for you and me".

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES HANDS

–sanitise your hands and touch as little as possible. Please take away the news sheet on your seat so that no one else touches it.

FACE – wear a face covering over mouth and nose. If you cannot do this, keep well away from everyone. **Extra distance MUST make up for no face covering.** (2M+).

SPACE – keep more than **2 metres (or 6 feet)** away from people not in your household. Please do not move the seats unless to move closer to a family member. **Seats must not be moved for any other reason and must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion, and anyone else** behind, beside or in front of you if not in your household. When you move for Communion, or to enter or leave the church, remember that the shortest route may always not be the safest – **always keep AT LEAST 2 metres distance.**

VENTILATION – We must keep fresh air coming in. Please follow instructions from stewards – they are there to help make sure that these guidelines are followed.
