The Government regulations state 'You can leave home to attend or visit a place of worship for communal worship... We shall remain open unless told otherwise and as long as we have volunteers. We must at this critical time, follow all the pandemic guidelines. Please make sure that you are familiar with what to do—see other page. These measures, if properly followed, help prevent the transmission of the virus. Restrictions can be changed by the government at short notice: please be aware that all our arrangements might therefore have to change quickly too. Equally, the availability of volunteers and clergy might suddenly change through illness or the need to isolate. The website, news sheet and notices on the church doors will carry news. Please remember that the obligation to be at Mass remains suspended. No one should be doing anything that makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable. Please consider carefully any risk you may be taking in coming to Mass. Is your own health good? Are you responsible for caring for someone else? Do have a job that places you at risk or needs you to stay away from risk? What do your family think? Have you been exposed to Covid-19? When you do come always remember - **HANDS - FACE - SPACE KEEP APART BY 2 METRES (6 FEET)** We **ALL** have a Christian duty to keep everyone in church **and** in wider society as safe as possible.

**TODAY IS RACIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY**, we are called to pray for the victims of racial prejudice and to work to end prejudice in all its forms. That work of course begins with each one of us, made as we all are, in the image and likeness of God.

**FR STEPHEN WRITES:** In the Scriptures for this Sunday, the promise is made in the first reading of God raising up a prophet to succeed Moses. He will speak with authority because God Himself will put His words into the prophet's mouth. In the Gospel the evil spirits put their word's into the mouth of the man they have possessed. Yet at the sound of Jesus's voice, at His command, the spirits flee. Here, Jesus speaks with authority because He is the very Word of God, the Word made flesh. What He says is spoken with authority because it is God who speaks. First, God sends His prophets, but finally He comes Himself in Jesus. No wonder the evil spirits were afraid, and so how great the reason for our confidence and trust. Jesus comes to conquer evil in all its forms and to lead those who trust in Him to the joys of salvation.

**FR PETER REFLECTS:** As the present lockdown continues, it is important that we keep remembering the decades-long magnificent, heroic, work done by the NHS and other key workers. I was moved to hear about Hussein, known as 'The Boy with two Hearts'. A poignant biography was published about him last year, at the start of the pandemic restrictions. The book charts how his family spent two years fleeing from Afghanistan to try and save his life. After undergoing an incredible 19 operations, Hussein lived for another 17 years. His brother, Hamed, with great gratitude, paid tribute to the doctors and nurses who cared for him: "It is a story of hope, shining a light on the wonderful healthcare system that my family will never take for granted." As a nation, may we, likewise, applaud such dedication too.

**ASH WEDNESDAY 2021** There will be no placing of ashes on peoples' foreheads in the usual way this year. That involves too much physical contact in a time of pandemic. Ashes will be part of Mass but how or whether to give them to individuals remains to be decided.

**THE RECTOR OF OSCOTT COLLEGE** Canon Giles Goward, who was appointed the Rector of the college only last June, died last Wednesday after a short illness. Please pray for him, for the students and staff of the College, and for Canon Giles's family and friends.

**ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES**  
**HANDS** – sanitise your hands and touch as little as possible. Please take away the news sheet on your seat so that no one else touches it.

**FACE** – wear a face covering over mouth and nose. If you cannot do this, keep well away from everyone. **Extra distance MUST make up for no face covering.** (2M++).

**SPACE** – keep more than **2 metres (or 6 feet)** away from people not in your household. Please do not move the seats unless to move closer to a family member. **Seats must not be moved for any other reason and must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion, and anyone else** behind, beside or in front of you if not in your household. When you move for Communion, or to enter or leave the church, remember that the shortest route may always not be the safest – **always keep AT LEAST 2 metres distance.**  
**VENTILATION** – We must keep fresh air coming in. Please follow instructions from stewards – they are there to help make sure that these guidelines are followed.
