The Government regulations state **'You can leave home to attend or visit a place of worship for communal worship... You should follow the guidance on the safe use of places of worship and must not mingle with anyone outside your household or support bubble when attending a place of worship'**. We shall remain open unless told otherwise and as long as we have volunteers. We must at this critical time, follow all the pandemic guidelines. Please make sure that you are familiar with what to do—see other page. These measures, if properly followed, help prevent the transmission of the virus. Restrictions can be changed by the government at short notice so please be aware that all our arrangements might therefore have to change quickly too. Equally, the availability of volunteers and clergy might suddenly change through illness or the need to isolate. The website, news sheet and notices on the church doors will carry news. Please remember that the obligation to be at Mass remains suspended. No one should be doing anything that makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable. Please consider carefully any risk you may be taking in coming to Mass. Is your own health good? Are you responsible for caring for someone else? Do you have a job that places you at risk or needs you to stay away from risk? What do your family think? Have you been exposed to Covid-19? FR STEPHEN WRITES: In the Sunday Scriptures this week, Job paints a less than cheery picture of human existence – repetitive, unrewarding, without a point. It is sometimes easy to think like this; our pandemic routines are very far from cheery, for example. But, as the Gospel tells us, Christ comes with an urgency and a clear purpose for human life. He comes to bring the good news of the Gospel, news of God's love and so of His interest in us. We have been created for a purpose, Christ comes to show us that and to help us fulfil it – pandemic or no pandemic!

FR PETER REFLECTS: "You'll never walk alone" is such a fitting epitaph for Captain Sir Tom. His brave 'little step' initiative for the NHS remains a giant, joy-filled leap for us to benefit from in the future. The simplicity of his visionary witness was hewn out of the bedrock of a conviction that: "Tomorrow will be a Good Day" if only everyone helps build up a culture of encouragement regardless of age, infirmity, social background or belief. Lent is appearing from within the Bethlehem star-lit gaze of the Church. Bringing many opportunities for us to become more Christ-like and so transform wherever we live. Let's not think of 'giving something up' but, like Captain Sir Tom, 'taking something on'. As St Mother Theresa says "doing small things with great love". He had no idea what his generosity would inspire – and neither can we our own. At this stage in the pandemic perhaps, more than ever, we mourn the loss of loved ones – the recently departed or those who went to their eternal rest long ago. My mind goes back to the Queen's first lockdown message, whose anniversary is shortly to arrive. She evoked a song of resurrection so familiar to us from Captain Sir Tom's war-time generation: "We'll Meet Again". Whatever our individual pace of life is currently, Jesus is our constant travelling companion. We never walk alone. He brings our loved ones with him as our "additional friends in Heaven" as St John Henry Newman describes them. They urge us on, applauding our every effort to grow in grace along our present Good Fridays. The dawn of Easter glory always shines to indicate our safest path. Until we greet those, gone before us, face to face, once again in God's house forevermore. That's the hope of every earthly 'au revoir' we make.

ASH WEDNESDAY 2021 Mass at 10.00am There will be no placing of ashes on peoples' foreheads in the usual way this year. That involves too much physical contact in a time of pandemic. Ashes will be part of Mass but how or whether to give them to individuals remains to be decided.

Likewise, the Holy Week liturgies will be modified to reduce the risk of transmitting the virus

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES
HANDS – sanitise, **FACE** – wear a face covering over mouth and nose, **SPACE** – stay 2 metres (or 6 feet) away from people not in your household. Please do not move the seats unless to move closer to a family member. **Seats must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion and anyone else.**

VENTILATION – We must keep fresh air coming in. Please follow instructions from stewards – they are there to help make sure that these guidelines are followed.
