FR STEPHEN WRITES: Jesus begins His ministry by going on retreat—He spends 40 days alone in the wilderness, our model for Lent. While there He is subject to temptation as opportunities to sin are put before Him. This temptation is resisted, and Satan driven off, but he will figure again as Holy Week arrives. Now Jesus comes to the people and announces a simple but joyful message. 'The time has come and the Kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News'. In other words, God is drawing close, be sorry for your sins and believe the Gospel—Jesus comes to save all people. So, the very first thing that Jesus asks us to do is to repent, to turn our backs on sin (the Greek original that mark wrote in means 'about face'), then free of guilt we can walk with Him into God's kingdom of love, peace and joy and live His risen life. There is an urgency in this as written by St Mark—now is the time! This Lent, seize the moment and make all our 'nows' a truly Christian moment.

FR PETER REFLECTS: My priest friends tell me that, while they're not getting ready for virtual Master Chef, just yet, the quality of meal options being produced during lockdown has gone up massively! As someone who has zero culinary skills, I'm envious! Even boiling an egg is a challenge! These conversations remind me of two famous spiritual writers. St Teresa of Avila and Brother Lawrence were both members of the Carmelite Order, who commented on the importance of kitchen work. St Teresa, given her country of birth, knew a thing or two about Spanish Omelettes. She encouraged us to "Reflect that God is there among the pots and pans and that He stands at your side." While Brother Lawrence, from Paris, the home of Quiche Lorraine, prayed: "Lord make me a Saint by baking and washing plates." In the busyness of a monastery kitchen, he said he retreated to the "Oratory in his heart". May we all appreciate, anew, the gift of food and those who share it with us.

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES HANDS—sanitise, FACE—wear a face covering over mouth and nose, SPACE—stay 2 metres (or 6 feet) away from people not in your household. Please do not move the seats unless to move closer to a family member. Seats must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion and anyone else. VENTILATION—We must keep fresh air coming in. Please follow instructions from stewards—they are there to help make sure that these guidelines are followed. Thank you to all our volunteers!

EMERGENCY PASTORAL CARE: This remains available of course, under the guidance given for the safety of all involved – carers, relatives, priest, *and* the person receiving the sacraments in an emergency. Routine sick visiting is very difficult: there is always a risk of any visitor (clergy or lay) unknowingly bringing Covid-19 with them or unknowingly taking it away to give to others.
