We are running a booking system for **Holy Thursday 7.30pm, Good Friday 3.00pm, Holy Saturday 7.30pm and Easter Sunday 10.45am**. Please book on the website **OR** in writing through the Presbytery front door **OR** by phone. Please also book by phone **OR** in writing for Sunday Masses too.

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES HANDS – sanitise, FACE – wear a face covering over mouth and nose, SPACE – stay 2 metres (or 6 feet) away from people not in your household.. Seats must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion and anyone else.

FR STEPHEN WRITES Today is a day of contrasts. We begin with the crowds hailing Jesus as king as He rides into Jerusalem. 'Hosanna!' they shout. But then His mission is to be accomplished by betrayal, rejection, pain and death. The 'Hosannas' become 'Crucify Him!', the joyful palms become clenched fists and the Cross. All this He submits to, meekly, without complaint for our sakes. We leave Mass today having heard of that loving sacrifice, knowing that God loves us so much that He sent His only Son. Reflect on that love, rejoice in that love, thank Him for it and look forward to the glory that His resurrection promises us.

FR PETER REFLECTS: In Holy Week, Pope Francis reminds us: "The call to experience Lent as a journey of conversion, prayer and sharing of our goods, helps us – as communities and individuals – to revive the faith that comes from the living Christ, the hope inspired by the breath of the Holy Spirit and the love flowing from the merciful heart of the Father. May Mary, Mother of the Saviour, ever faithful at the foot of the cross and in the heart of the Church, sustain us with her loving presence. May the blessing of the risen Lord accompany all of us on our journey towards the light of Easter."

CONFESSION: May be celebrated outdoors in a public space maintaining social distancing. Please ask the priests.

EMERGENCY PASTORAL CARE: This remains available of course, under the guidance given for the safety of all involved – carers, relatives, priest, **and** the person receiving the sacraments in an emergency. Routine sick visiting is difficult: there is always a risk of any visitor (clergy or lay) unknowingly bringing Covid-19 with them or unknowingly taking it away to give to others.
