FR STEPHEN WRITES: 'Hail thee, festival day, great day that art hallowed for ever, day wherein Christ arose, breaking the kingdom of death!

Today is indeed a day of festivity for Christ is risen! Alleluia! Having taken flesh from us, through Mary, having shared in our death, He now rises from the dead to take from us death's victory. We have seen the deepest expression of love as Christ poured out His life for us. Today, we see the greatest consequence of this as the hope of resurrection dawns for us all. The disciples at first cannot quite grasp what's happened—how could they? But the truth dawns on them that Jesus is indeed alive so that when He called Himself the Way, the Truth and the Life, He meant it! Our journey as Christians is thus filled with hope and joy. Despite the suffering and confusion of the world, Easter has transformed everything. As Pope Benedict says... Indeed, the cure for death does exist. Christ is the tree of life, once more within our reach. If we remain close to him, then we have life. Hence, during this night of resurrection, with all our hearts we shall sing the alleluia, the song of joy that has no need of words. Hence, Paul can say to the Philippians: 'Rejoice in the Lord always, again I will say, rejoice!' (Phil 4:4). Joy cannot be commanded. It can only be given. The risen Lord gives us joy: true life.

FR PETER REFLECTS: The Gospels record that Jesus, 'suddenly' appears after his resurrection to his disciples. Whether they are the women running from the tomb; Mary Magdalene in the garden surrounding it; the frightened 11 in a locked room; or the walkers, Cleopas and his companion, on the Emmaus road. They are surprised to join Jesus for the fish-fry breakfast he's prepared and when he promised to be with them, always, through the power of the Holy Spirit, at Pentecost. Each episode reveals that Our Lord is no longer bound by time and space anymore. They illustrate that this Easter gift is always shared in daily-life settings common to his family and friends. Therefore, as Jesus's 21st Century followers, we are guaranteed that we will experience the Lord wherever we are, whatever we are doing, because he is never apart from us. Christ has died, is risen and perpetually comes to us in every moment, now and in the future. Let us pray for eyes to see, minds to receive, hearts to believe, lips to confess and lives which proclaim his presence amongst us.

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES HANDS – sanitise, FACE – wear a face covering over mouth and nose, SPACE – stay 2 metres (or 6 feet) away from people not in your household. Seats must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion and anyone else.

WE ARE FILLING UP AT 1045 MASS... There will be an extra Mass at 1230 when university term begins again later in April but unless we have more volunteer stewards it remains impossible to increase the number of Masses. We are sorry if you can't be fitted into the church: our Covid safe number is a very limiting 30. Our partnered parish St Thomas More currently has spaces at both its weekend Masses if you wish to go there while this problem lasts. (Saturday 5pm, Sunday 9am).

Have you considered giving by standing order, direct from your bank account to the parish's? BAPTISMS AND WEDDINGS: Over the next months the numbers allowed to attend may slowly increase.

FUNERALS: under the restrictions on all public Masses, **no more than 25 people**, stewards and cleaners needed.

CONFESSION: May be celebrated outdoors in a public space maintaining social distancing. Please ask the priests.

EMERGENCY PASTORAL CARE: This remains available of course, under the guidance given for the safety of all involved – carers, relatives, priest, *and* the person receiving the sacraments in an emergency. Routine sick visiting is difficult: there is always a risk of any visitor (clergy or lay) unknowingly bringing Covid-19 with them or unknowingly taking it away to give to others.
