FR STEPHEN WRITES: In November 1981, Pope St John Paul II declared: 'Right from the beginning of my ministry in St. Peter's See in Rome, I consider this message [of Divine Mercy] my special task. Providence has assigned it to me in the present situation of man, the Church, and the world. It could be said that precisely this situation assigned that message to me as my task before God'. What is this message of Divine Mercy? At heart, it is about the very nature of God Himself. In the Old Testament God revealed His longing for the wicked to turn from their wickedness and live and on the Cross God revealed again His gift of mercy 'Father, forgive them...' It was in Krakow in the 1930s that St Faustina received a revelation of God's mercy that has become the popular form of devotion to God's mercy. Trust in Jesus is at the centre of this - there is thus nothing novel or new-fangled in devotion to the Divine Mercy. It is devotion to Jesus to which He Himself has called us always since His first words in Mark's Gospel -'Repent and believe'. As John-Paul II said 'Those who sincerely say 'Jesus, I trust in You' will find comfort in all their anxieties and fears. There is nothing more man needs than Divine Mercy - that love which is benevolent, which is compassionate, which raises man above his weakness to the infinite heights to the holiness of God'.

FR PETER REFLECTS: We navigate any given circumstances, where careful decisions are needed, depending upon whose 'shoes' we put on to mentally 'walk around', in our minds, what is happening to us. We might, initially, choose the comfort of our own footwear. Before comparing and contrasting it with brands provided by the trusted wisdom of family, friends or the wider community. Whichever we pick, to start travelling the terrain before us, we should always use the ability for making the right choices we call our conscience. This word, from its Latin root, means 'bringing together - in order to know'. During our imaginary journey, St John Henry Newman, our local Midlands Saint, says that the evidence we gather about how to best proceed needs to be informed by the commandments and teachings of the Church. He likened this process to being like a mountaineer searching for the next secure toe and finger hold, when climbing the rock of life's experiences, as we move towards heaven as our goal. As we see where we need to go next, we hear Jesus say deep within our hearts: "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I am sending you." (Jn 20, v20).

Numbers will still be limited in church alas, but this great day, as restrictions begin to ease, is an opportunity to do something special at last, however modest it may seem. ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES HANDS – sanitise, FACE – wear a face covering over mouth and nose, SPACE – stay 2 metres (or 6 feet) away from people not in your household. Seats must

always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle <u>and</u> the point of Communion <u>and</u> anyone else not in your household.

WE ARE FILLING UP AT 1045 MASS... There will be an extra Mass at 1230 when university term begins again on April 25 but until we have more volunteer stewards it remains impossible to increase the number of Parish Masses. We are sorry if you can't be fitted into the church: our Covid safe number is a very limiting 30. Our partnered parish St Thomas More currently has spaces at both its weekend Masses if you wish to go there while this problem lasts. (Saturday 5pm, Sunday 9am).

GIVING ENVELOPES & STANDING ORDERS The new boxes of envelopes are ready at church but clearly it is not straightforward to distribute them to everyone. Have you considered giving by standing order, direct from your bank account to the parish's? If you are an income taxpayer, sign up for Gift Aid which adds 25% to your giving at no cost to you. BAPTISMS AND WEDDINGS: Over the next months the numbers allowed to attend may slowly increase.

FUNERALS: under the restrictions on all public Masses, **no more than 25 people**, stewards and cleaners needed.

CONFESSION: May be celebrated outdoors in a public space maintaining social distancing. Please ask the priests.

EMERGENCY PASTORAL CARE: This remains available of course, under the guidance given for the safety of all involved – carers, relatives, priest, *and* the person receiving the sacraments in an emergency. Routine sick visiting is difficult: there is always a risk of any visitor (clergy or lay) unknowingly bringing Covid-19 with them or unknowingly taking it away to give to others.
