FR STEPHEN WRITES: Today, as we continue our Easter celebrations, we hear Peter preaching to the people about the risen Christ. He does not shrink from reminding them that they shouted for Barabbas to be freed and for

the innocent Christ to be killed. After all, God has foretold the suffering of His Son through the prophets. Neither does Peter shrink from telling them what to do next: repent and turn to God so that their sins may be wiped out. This is essentially what Jesus Himself says in today's gospel. The disciples are confused by Christ's resurrection to begin with. He needs to help them understand both by showing His wounds and explaining the teaching of the prophets. Not only that, but in continuing Jesus's command to take bread and break it they find that He is known and present through this great sacrament of the Altar. And then come the results of this: the preaching of repentance and forgiveness of sins in His name, which is what Peter is doing in the first reading.

FR PETER REFLECTS: As we prepare to celebrate our parish feast day on Ist May, let us join in with Pope Francis: "Every day, for over forty years, following Lauds I have recited a nineteenth century French prayer to Saint Joseph...It expresses devotion and trust, and even poses a certain challenge to Saint Joseph: Glorious Saint Joseph, whose power makes the impossible possible, come to my aid in these times of anguish and difficulty. Take under your protection the serious and troubling situations that I commend to you, that they may have a happy outcome. My beloved father, all my trust is in you. Let is not be said that I invoked you in vain, and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary, show me that your goodness is as great as your power. Amen." (*Patris Corde*, I).

ALWAYS REMEMBER THE BASIC COVID RULES HANDS – sanitise, FACE – wear a face covering over mouth and nose, SPACE – stay 2 metres (or 6 feet) away from people not in your household. Seats must always be AT LEAST 2 metres from the aisle and the point of Communion and anyone else not in your household.

WE ARE FILLING UP AT 1045 MASS... There will be an extra Mass at 1230 when university term begins again on April 25 but until we have more volunteer stewards it remains impossible to increase the number of Parish Masses. We are sorry if you can't be fitted into the church: our Covid safe number is a very limiting 30. Our partnered

parish St Thomas More currently has spaces at both its weekend Masses if you wish to go there while this problem lasts. (Saturday 5pm, Sunday 9am).

GIVING ENVELOPES & STANDING ORDERS The new boxes of envelopes are ready at church but clearly it is not straightforward to distribute them to everyone. Have you considered giving by standing order, direct from your bank account to the parish's? If you are an income taxpayer, sign up for Gift Aid which adds 25% to your giving at no cost to you. CONFESSION: May be celebrated outdoors in a public space maintaining social distancing. Please ask the priests.

EMERGENCY PASTORAL CARE: This remains available of course, under the guidance given for the safety of all involved – carers, relatives, priest, **and** the person receiving the sacraments in an emergency. Routine sick visiting is difficult: there is always a risk of any visitor (clergy or lay) unknowingly bringing Covid-19 with them or unknowingly taking it away to give to others.
