WHO'S WHO AMONG THE SJW CLERGY ..?

Fr Stephen - the tall one, with combed back hair and round glasses – is parish priest here **and** parish priest of St Thomas More

Fr Peter – not so tall, with a brummie accent and proud of it – is assistant priest here **and** assistant Catholic chaplain at the University

Deacon David – white hair and sounding like he comes from Essex (which of course he does) – is the Catholic Chaplain to Warwick University *and* the parish deacon. Do say hello and introduce yourselves: the clergy will be outside as you leave.

FR STEPHEN WRITES: As we pray for vocations today, Pope Francis calls us to think of St Joseph whose vocation was revealed to him in dreams: to be the husband of the Mother of God, to protect her and her Son, to nurture and teach. Pope Francis writes 'I like to think, then, of Saint Joseph, the protector of Jesus and of the Church, as the protector of vocations. In fact, from his willingness to serve comes his concern to protect. The Gospel tells us that "Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night" (Mt 2:14), thus revealing his prompt concern for the good of his family. He wasted no time fretting over things he could not control, in order to give full attention to those entrusted to his care. Such thoughtful concern is the sign of a true vocation, the testimony of a life touched by the love of God. What a beautiful example of Christian life we give when we refuse to pursue our ambitions or indulge in our illusions, but instead care for what the Lord has entrusted to us through the Church! God then pours out his Spirit and creativity upon us; he works wonders in us, as he did in Joseph'. Full text at the Bishops' Conference website.

FR PETER REFLECTS: As we celebrate our parish feast on Ist May, we think about Pope Francis's words: God looks on the heart (cf. I Sam 16:7), and in Saint Joseph he recognised the heart of a father, able to give and generate life in the midst of daily routines. Vocations have this same goal: to beget and renew lives every day. The Lord desires to shape the hearts of fathers and mothers: hearts that are open, capable of great initiatives, generous in self-giving, compassionate in comforting anxieties and steadfast in strengthening hopes. The priesthood and the consecrated life greatly need these qualities nowadays, in times marked by fragility but also by sufferings due to the pandemic, which has spawned uncertainties and fears about the future and the very meaning of life. Saint Joseph comes to meet us in his gentle way, as one of "the saints next door". At the same time, his strong witness can guide us on the journey.
