FR STEPHEN WRITES: AFTER LOCKDOWN ENDS

The guidance from the Bishops has been made public. It is no surprise that it fully echoes the Government's call for caution and the scientific community's warning that the pandemic is not yet over. The Bishops write –

'It is important to reiterate that... the general principles of continuing to create a safe environment in places of worship and their ancillary buildings are not abandoned'.

It is therefore strongly recommended by the Bishops (listening to healthcare professionals and to the Government) that we continue to -

- + Use face coverings + Use hand sanitiser
- + Ventilate the church building + Use Track & Trace
- + Clean the church after weekend Masses
- + Maintain social distance of Im if at all possible
 Just because it is legal to do something does not mean that
 it should be done!

On Wednesday 21 July, more seating will be brought into church to discover what a safe and sensible lay out might be, bearing in mind likely demand, and the need to have space.

On Friday 23 July, public weekday Masses will resume On Sunday 25 July, tea and coffee will be available after the 1045 Mass for those who wish to stay for it. We are not yet certain about music, servers and eucharistic ministers but these will come in due time. Many other things may well follow too – but please remember that, at present, we have only about 60 people coming to Mass, and that we are approaching the holiday season anyway. Returning to pre-Covid 'normal' will be a process that will take a while and not be a sudden event. As the Prime Minister has said, the pandemic is not over.

To help with establishing what is possible and when, a questionnaire will be circulated today asking if people would soon like to resume the roles they had, or if they'd like to wait a bit. It will also ask if anyone would like to take on something new. We start by circulating this in church because, obviously, those of you who come to Mass are prepared to be out and about, mixing with people. That clearly cannot be assumed about those who aren't here. The questionnaire does not include absolutely everything that we might have or do, so please remember that just because something isn't mentioned now it does **not** mean that we shan't have it later! There is space for you to volunteer for anything not mentioned.

No one should feel any pressure whatever to make a commitment to doing something they'd rather not.

FR PETER REFLECTS: Archbishop Bernard wants to put young people and families at the centre of the diocesan planning. I'm sure he was inspired by Pope Francis's words: "The Lord is calling us to enkindle stars in the night of young people. He asks you to look to the true stars, all those varied signs he gives us to guide our way, and to imitate the farmer who watches the stars before going out to plough his field. God lights up stars to help us keep walking: The stars shine in their watches and are glad; he calls them and they say: 'Here we are!' (Bar 3:34-35). Christ himself is our great light of hope and our guide in the night, for he is the "bright morning" (Rev 22:16). Sometime ago, a friend asked me what I see in a young person. My response was that "I see someone who is searching for his or own path, who wants to fly on their two feet, who faces the

world and looks at the horizon with eyes full of the future, full of hope as well as illusions. A young person stands on two feet as adults do, but unlike adults, whose feet are parallel, he always has one foot forward, ready to sort out, to spring ahead. Always racing onwards. To talk about young people is to talk about promise and to talk about joy. Young people have so much strength; they are able to look ahead with hope. A young person is a promise of life that implies a certain degree of tenacity. He is foolish enough to delude himself and resilient enough to recover from that delusion." (*Christus Vincit* 33, 143).
