WHO'S WHO AMONG THE PARISH CLERGY..?

<u>Fr Stephen</u> - the tall one, with combed back hair and round glasses - is parish priest here and parish priest of St Thomas More. He is based at St Thomas More <u>Fr Peter</u> - not so tall, with a brummie accent and proud of it - is assistant priest here and assistant Catholic chaplain at the University. Fr Peter is at SJW nearly every day

<u>Deacon David</u> – white hair and sounding like he comes from Surrey (which he does) – is the **Catholic Chaplain** to **Warwick University** and the parish deacon here.

ALL MASSES ARE NOW PUBLIC Please come and celebrate Mass in person if you are able and feel safe being out and about. The weekday Masses, with their small congregations, are obviously the safest way to come back to Mass. You may also see how the church is kept safe. If you have not been back yet, now's the time.

FR STEPHEN WRITES: All the readings for today's great feast speak about the same thing: the uniqueness of Our Lady and her rightful place in heaven. King David prepares a special place for the Ark of God, the 'box' of God's presence among His people. The Israelites rejoice. Our Lady was the first dwelling place of God made flesh: we rejoice before her. St Paul speaks of the end of death's sting and victory because lesus's resurrection shows that death is not the end. Our Lady's Assumption places her among the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. It is the Christian hope that all God's faithful will also be the fruits of Jesus's resurrection, just like His Blessed Mother. A woman in the crowd shouts at Jesus how happy must be the womb that bore him. True of course, but Jesus replies that happier still are those that hear and keep the word of God. Keeping the word of God is exactly what Mary did. It is her faithfulness to God that makes possible her Mothering of God. In that way, we can all be like Mary—not in our physical mothering of Jesus because that's already been done, but in hearing and keeping of God's word. Through Mary and her faithfulness, God has done wonderful things for her, and praise God, for us too FR PETER REFLECTS: The second of Archbishop Bernard's priorities for the diocesan vision "Behold, I am making all things new" (Rev 21:5) is that of Formation: Growing leaders in our churches, schools and parish communities. St John Paul II writes, addressing educators in Melbourne, Australia, in 1986: "Baptism is a call from Christ, a call which affects our whole life, the way we act and think. It moulds our attitudes and behaviour. This is seen very clearly in the work of a Catholic teacher. The impact you have upon your students and especially upon their faith in Christ will depend on the vitality of your own Christian life, and on the motives, attitudes and principles which shape your behaviour. Both primary and secondary schools must work closely with the family and the parish if they are to foster effectively the Christian formation of the pupils. This is a noble work in which parents, teachers and clergy all collaborate...Success in this field will mean more dedicated members of society and the Church, more young men and women who are deeply committed to Christ. The extent to which Catholic schools contribute to the continual renewal of the Church depends on how successfully they foster continual conversion of heart...To all of you, teachers, administrators and students, I say with Saint Paul: "Be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind...May our Lord Jesus Christ give you truth and wisdom! May he fill your hearts with his love!"
