FR STEPHEN WRITES: THE FUTURE (Part 2) In today's Gospel, Jesus signals a future of faith not so much dependent on a written law but on a living relationship, a relationship with Him. This does not mean that there are no commandments, but rather that we are led by the Risen Christ – we follow Him and not written regulations. He is the pattern of our life, provides the strength to live it and offers mercy when we are sorry for our failings. This is a radical change in the minds of His listeners. In the Church, change has happened and continues to happen. Just look at the effects of the pandemic; more than

In the Church, change has happened and continues to happen. Just look at the effects of the pandemic: more than half of our pre-lockdown Mass goers are not coming, social activities are restricted, income is reduced. There will be more change to come as eventually society learns to manage life with the virus and congregational numbers settle into whatever the number will be — whether greater, the same or less. The diminishing number of priests will continue to affect things too.

So what can we do? First, celebrate in faith all that God has done for us and pray for the Spirit's gift of wisdom as we go forward. We can do those things on 8 September when rejoice in 40 years of the church building. Please come! (Do book to avoid disappointment, seating is limited). Secondly, we go forward in faith and openness. Will the parish have changed so as to need new approaches to Mass times, social events, fundraising, and consultation? The next twelve months will reveal a lot for this parish and every other parish too. For us, this is also a celebratory year: we rejoice in the past building of this church, we live and act in the present, we plan for and go forward into the future.

FR PETER REFLECTS: The fourth theme of the Archdiocesan vision: Unfolding God's Plan emphasised by Archbishop Bernard is Social Outreach. Pope Francis explores how the role of men and women scientists must always serve Justice: "No scientific knowledge should stand alone and believe it is self-sufficient. In its specificity, (it) contributes to the growth of a new culture capable of building society by promoting the dignity and development of every man and woman. In the face of new challenges, you, dear friends of science, are entrusted with the task of bearing witness to the possibility of constructing a new social bond, committing yourself to making scientific research close to the whole community, from the local to the international one, and showing that together it is possible to overcome every conflict. Science is a great resource for building peace! I ask you to accompany the formation of the new generations teaching them not to be afraid of the effort of research. The Master (Jesus) also lets Himself be sought: He instils in everyone the certainty that when one seeks honestly, one encounters the truth. The changing age needs new disciples of knowledge, and you, dear scientists, are the teachers of a new generation of peacemakers." (Message to the International Meeting of

'Science for Peace', 2nd July 2021 on the feast of St Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows whose shrine is located near to the Italian National Laboratories for Nuclear Physics).
