FR PETER REFLECTS: Archbishop Bernard's diocesan vision second priority is FORMATION. On Education Sunday the words of St John Paul II are very apt: The task of the teacher and the school is indeed a sacred trust conveyed to them by parents and families... To you is given to create the future and give it direction by offering to your students a set of values with which to assess their newly discovered knowledge. Few challenges are more exciting and rewarding than the instruction and guidance of young people, and few more difficult... No one else will ever be where you are. No one else will ever have the opportunity you have to accompany students in their search for truth, to foster in them a thirst for justice, and an appreciation of the goodness of God, to lead them patiently and lovingly in the journey of faith. Young people are hungry today for truth and justice because they are hungry for God. To respond to the hunger is the highest calling of the Christian educator. In partnership with the parents who bear the primary responsibility for the education of their children, the teacher is called upon to reflect, in faithful and
