FR PETER REFLECTS: The Synod Pathway: 2021-2023 As COP26 begins, Pope Francis's words in Laudato Si are apt: "Climate change is a global problem with grave implications: environmental, social, economic, political and for the distribution of goods...lts worst impact will probably be felt by developing countries in the coming decades. Many of the poor live in areas particularly affected by phenomena related to warming, and their means of subsistence are largely dependent on natural reserves and ecosystemic services such as agriculture, fishing and forestry...Changes in climate, to which animals and plants cannot adapt, lead them to migrate; this in turn affects the livelihood of the poor, who are forced to leave their homes, with great uncertainty for the future and that of their children...They are not recognized by international conventions as refugees; they bear the loss of lives they left behind, without enjoying any legal protection...Our lack of response to these tragedies involving our brothers and sisters points to the loss of that sense of responsibility for our fellow men and women upon which all civil society is founded". Details here on the Diocesan website. The prayer for the Synodal process is one used at all great gatherings in the Church for centuries, perhaps most famously at Vatican II. It is by St Isidore of Seville, the brilliant mind of the 6-7th centuries and is a beautiful prayer to the Holy Spirit—

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather

together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts. Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity, so that we may journey together to eternal life and do not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. **Amen**
