THE SYNODAL PROCESS IN THE PARISH First, this sheet will continue to direct you to information and online events, most of which will be on the diocesan website [here](#) This is a prime source of information which is still being given out. This will provide background so that in due course as we organise things in the parish, everyone may be well informed. After Christmas, we shall be meeting to engage with this process but there will be other ways too so that not being able to attend meetings is no barrier. PARISH FINANCES & GIVING ENVELOPES & STANDING ORDERS The collection basket is just inside the church doors, on the font. *The parish continues to suffer financially as it has since the pandemic began.* (The finances of the two parishes, St Thomas More and St Joseph the Worker, remain separate because they remain separate parishes). Have you collected your giving envelopes? Have you considered giving by standing order, direct from your bank account to the parish's? If you are an **income taxpayer**, sign up for Gift Aid which adds 25% to your giving at no cost to you. Please see June Palmer or contact the parish. When asked which church, select 'Coventry: Canley'. **Thank you for your giving, especially in these times.**

THE PARISH HALL This is very gradually being brought back into use. **First, by the parish for tea and coffee** after the 1045 Mass. **It is not yet open for general bookings.**
