THE READINGS THIS WEEK

The presence of God in the midst of Israel ▲ means that there is no more evil to fear and that it is time to shout for joy. The prophet Zephaniah gives us a truly joyful picture of God living amongst his people. Centuries later. John the Baptist shouts this time, proclaiming the presence of Christ, the Word made flesh, among his people. His hearers are seized with enthusiasm. "What must we do?". So John, directly and plainly tells them—give up sin. Being in the presence of God demands of us a response, rejoicing and repentance. We rejoice that God loves us so much that He is among us, with us, one of us but we repent of having failed Him. We are unworthy to draw close to Him without His saving forgiveness. We shall not receive this forgiveness if we first do not realise we need it, and secondly we do not ask for it. But then what joy awaits those whose know his loving, forgiving presence with them now. For many, going to confession has lost any sense of joy or of the presence of God. Yet it is truly an opportunity to know our sins, to know our need of God's mercy and then -joy of joys- to know his forgiveness in an intimate and personal way. Then we may rejoice in his presence with sins forgiven and our relationship with him restored.

His coming is as sure as the dawn...

FR PETER REFLECTS

On this Gaudate Sunday, Pope Francis's words inspire us: "Everything changes when we give first place to the Lord. This is what conversion is! As far as Christ is concerned. we need only open the door and let him enter in and work his wonders. Just as the desert and the preaching of John the Baptist were all it took for Christ to come into the world. The Lord asks for nothing more. Let us ask for the grace to believe that with God things really do change, that he will banish our fears, heal our wounds, turn our arid places into springs of water. Let us ask for the grace of hope, since hope revives our faith and rekindles our charity. It is this hope that the deserts (existential and environmental) of today's world are thirsting...Let us now ask Holy Mary our Mother to help us become, like her, witnesses of hope and sowers of joy all around us, for hope, dear brothers and siters, never disappoints" (Apostolic Journey to Cyprus and Greece, 2021).

THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS & CURRENT GUIDELINES

Everything that happens in church should still be done carefully to minimise risk. Everyone who enters is asked **sanitise hands**, **wear a face covering** and **respect distance**.

BAPTISMS

Baptism may be celebrated, please with precautions above. Please see one of the clergy after a weekend Mass.

WEDDINGS

Weddings may be celebrated with the conditions described above. Please make an appointment with Fr Stephen: six months notice best.

CONFESSION at STM

It is available before 5pm Mass in the well ventilated confessional and also by appointment.

CONFESSION at SJW

Please ask one of the priests: the confessional at SJW is not ventilated and so cannot be used.

FUNERALS

Funerals may be celebrated, but please with the precautions above.

MASS

The Bishops, in line with guidance from the Government and scientists ask that we continue to -

Ventilate the church well Sanitise hands

Cover mouth AND nose

Keep a distance—at least 1 metre
We have a Christian duty of care to one another
and to wider society. Please make sure you
have your Covid jabs: if we don't catch Covid
we can't pass it on. Test yourself too.
