THE READINGS THIS WEEK

OD HAS GREAT GIFTS FOR US that He is quite prepared to be generous with, for they are given to build up His Church in service of

Him and our neighbour. But we cannot choose the gift He gives—after all, God knows more about our own needs and wants more we do ourselves—nor can we expect gifts at all if we decide not to work with Him. At the wedding feast, Jesus is hugely generous with the amount and quality of wine He provides. Yet the stewards have to do as He tells them and fill the stone jars with water first. But once that is done, Jesus transforms and provides. This miracle not only reveals who Jesus is, but shows how He has the power to transform us and provide for us, if we will co-operate with Him. 'Do whatever he tells you', says Our Lady. That's exactly what she did! Pope Francis's Synodal pathway is an attempt to discover what it is God wants us to do for His Church. May Mary's prayers help to hear God's will that she, full of the Holy Spirit, will help us do whatever He tells us. No one has let the Spirit work through her more than Mary, after all.

FR PETER REFLECTS

As we prepare for our joint parishes opening Synodal Pathway Meeting, Pope Francis's words remind us of its significance:

'The Gospels frequently show us Jesus "on a journey"; he walks alongside people and listens to the guestions and concerns lurking in their hearts. He shows us that God is not found in neat and orderly places, distant from reality, but walks ever at our side. He meets us where we are, on the often rocky roads of life. Celebrating a Synod means walking on the same road, walking together. Let us look at Jesus. First he *encounters* the rich man on the road; (Mark 10:17) he *listens* to his guestions and helps him discern what he must do to inherit eternal life. The three verbs that characterize the Synod are Encounter, Listen and discern... Jesus calls us, as he did the rich man in the Gospel, to empty ourselves, to free ourselves from all that is worldly, including our inward-looking and outworn pastoral models; and to ask ourselves what it is that God wants to say to us at this time. And the direction in which he wants to lead us.'

THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS & CURRENT GUIDELINES

Everything that happens in church should still be done carefully to minimise risk. Everyone who enters is asked sanitise hands, wear a face covering and respect distance. Please take a lateral flow test regularly and please have your vaccinations.

BAPTISMS

Baptism may be celebrated, please with precautions above. Please see one of the clergy after a weekend Mass.

WEDDINGS

Weddings may be celebrated with the conditions described above. Please make an appointment with Fr Stephen: six months notice best.

CONFESSION at STM

It is available before 5pm Mass on Saturdays in the well ventilated confessional and is also available by appointment at other times.

CONFESSION at SJW

Please ask one of the priests: the confessional at SJW is not ventilated and so cannot be used.

FUNERALS

Funerals may be celebrated, but please with the precautions above.

MASS

The Bishops, in line with guidance from the Government and scientists ask that we continue to -

Ventilate the church well Sanitise hands

Cover mouth AND nose: this is compulsory Keep a distance—at least 1 metre

We have a Christian duty of care to one another and to wider society. Please make sure you have your Covid jabs: if we don't catch Covid we can't pass it on. Test yourself too.
