reliable and dependable is a difficult task. All of us will have been let down by somebody, and all of us will

have let someone else down. So, Jeremiah can contrast the man who trusts in other men, and the man who trusts in God. Only God will never fail us and leave us in a mess. Jesus points out the happiness of doing as God wills, and not trying to find security in earthly things. There are more reliable indications of our worth than what others say about us, and how well we fit the world's standards. There is only one set of eternal standards, and one perfect God. It is by these that we shall be judged, and by these that our real worth will be revealed.

FR PETER REFLECTS

Pope Francis continues his teaching on St Joseph:

"In last weeks catechesis again inspired by Saint Joseph, we reflected on the meaning of the communion of saints. And leading on from this, today, I would like to explore the special devotion that Christian people have always had for Saint Joseph as the patron saint of a good death. And emotion born of the thought that Joseph died cared for by the Virgin Mary and Jesus, before leaving the house of Nazareth. There is no historical data, but since we no longer see Joseph in public life, it is thought that he died there in Nazareth, with his family. And Jesus and Mary accompanied him up to his death. May Saint Joseph help us to live the mystery of death in the best possible way. For a Christian, the good death is an experience of the mercy of God, who comes close to us even in that last moment of our life. In the hail Mary, we pray asking Our Lady to be close to us at the hour of our death. Precisely for this reason, I would like to conclude this catechesis by praying together to Our Lady for the dying, for those who are experiencing this moment of passage through the dark door, as Pope Benedict has recently described it referring to himself, and for relatives who are experiencing bereavement" (General Audience 9th February 2022).

Funerals may be celebrated, but please with the precautions above.
